JULIO ENCE AND TOXIC WAS

"Breaking through the stalemate - nonviolence and the toxic waste issue" Saturday, 18th January 1992, 10.30 - 4.30 in the Guildhall, L'Derry.

The winter DNATE conference will be taking place in Stroke City/Derry/Londonderry on 18th January on an issue that is of burning importance (burning importance, geddit!) to the city - the proposed toxic waste incinerator. However even those who are not especially into things toxic should still find it an excellent day in terms of the approaches and areas covered.

The conference is hosted by INNATE members in Derry, and is the first time an INNATE conference has been held outside Belfast. There may be some travel subsidies for people travelling from afar, and there is also the possibility of overnight accompdation in Derry for those who need it.

The programme wil include a choice of workshops in the morning; Women and non violence with Mary May Mullan; Toxic tactics with Rob Fairmichael; 'To the streets' with the Toxic Theatre Company; 'Campaigning and the media' with Stephen Price. There will be an update of the antitoxic waste campaign after lunch, followed by a session on 'Building alliances' - thentifying common ground in a controversial issue; the former will be led by rim O'Neill, the latter by Silsen Healy and Jerry Tyrrell.

The fee for the day is £3.50 (unwaged £2.50) plus £1.50 for vegetarian soup and sandwich lunch.
